High Plains Public Radio participates in the following activities that supplement Non-Vacancy specific recruitment activities:

1. HPPR utilizes the services of the Community Service Program for troubled youth and adults to encourage interest in careers in public broadcasting as well as opportunities to gain experience in the context a "real" work environment.
2. HPPR uses several media to enhance recruitment via HPPR's website, newspaper advertisements and radio spots that air on HPPR. In addition, HPPR participates in various job banks such as: KS Job Bank, Amarillo Non-Profit Listserv, and DEI Jobsite.
3. HPPR participates in the KAB Scholarship Program which financially assists students seeking a career in broadcasting.
4. HPPR's volunteer coordinator, Jonell Friend works in conjunction with the Retired Senior Citizens Volunteer Program (RSVP) to promote and utilize volunteerism. These individuals assist with mailing out renewal notices to our members each month.
5. HPPR staff invites and conducts many tours each year for new board members, station members and other guests. The staff also promotes public awareness of public radio broadcasting.
6. The Director of Membership Support, Jacob Breeden established an Internship Program in January of 2009 allowing students to acquire various skills including: broadcast preparation of community calendar events, various journalism tasks, and assisting with marketing research and planning.
